Who is eligible to be mentored?

Second to final year female law students at Deakin, Monash, La Trobe, Melbourne and Victoria University law schools. First year students (including JD), legal trainees and practical legal training students are ineligible.

Who is eligible to be a mentor?

Any <u>admitted</u> female legal practitioner, regardless of where and if they are currently employed.

How does the matching process work?

Wherever possible, law students and mentors will be paired based on common professional interests, life experiences and geographic proximity. All pairs will be issued with guidelines and encouraged to meet on a monthly basis, especially at VWL and WBA functions. As in previous years, if there is a shortage of mentors, preference will be given to more senior students.

What about the launch function?

All participants will be invited to an evening launch function introduced by Her Honour Justice Neave AO. Successful applicants will be advised of further details about the function in due course.
